Where a player and/or either parent was born in a country or a player is resident in a country other than the one for which eligibility is claimed the IIHF may require further evidence of nationality and compliance with IIHF By-law 205.

I, the undersigned, declare, on my honour that

- a) I am under the jurisdiction of the National Association I represent;
- b) I acknowledge that I do not have a right of entry to or participation in an IIHF Championship and such entry is governed by the Statutes, By-laws, Regulations and decisions of the IIHF;
- c) I have been informed about the eligibility rule of the IIHF By-law 205;
- d) I understand the rules specified on the back of this form (players who have changed their citizenship or are citizens of two or more countries);
- e) I voluntarily participate in the Championship.
- f) I am fully aware that neither the IIHF nor the Organising National Association may be held liable for any injury or illness howsoever it may arise and that it is my responsibility to accept that risk and/or to satisfy myself that such risks are covered by my National Association
- g) I am fully aware that I may be held liable for damages to third parties or property arising from my actions and that it is my responsibility to accept that risk and/or to satisfy myself that such risks are covered by my National Association.
- h) I agree to abide by and observe the IIHF Statutes, By-laws and Regulations (including those related to Medical Doping Control) and the decisions by the IIHF and the Championship Directorate in all matters including disciplinary measures, not to involve any third party whatsoever outside of the IIHF in the resolution of any dispute whatsoever arising in connection with the IIHF Championship and/or the Statutes, By-laws and Regulations and decisions made by the IIHF relating thereto excepting where having exhausted the appeal procedures within the IIHF in which case I undertake to submit any such dispute to the jurisdiction of the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland for definitive and final resolution. For any post championship Disciplinary proceedings it is understood that my national association is entrusted to represent me unless I notify the designated IIHF Disciplinary bodies differently.
- i) I acknowledge that although the current official playing rules of the IIHF relate to the use of protective equipment out of concern for the orderly play of the game and for the safety, health and welfare of participants and may reduce the risk of injury, such rules do not imply a warrant by the IIHF that such equipment will provide protection from injury.
- j) and hereby I agree to be filmed, televised, photographed, identified and otherwise recorded during the IIHF Championship event under conditions and for the purposes now or hereafter authorised by the IIHF in relation to the promotion of the IIHF Championship tournament and ice hockey events organised by the IIHF and that all photographs and moving images taken by me at the IIHF Championship tournament, including those of athletes competing within IIHF Championship venues, shall be used solely for personal and non-commercial purposes, unless prior written consent is obtained from the IIHF.
- k) I authorise the IIHF to use the personal data provided for broadcast and/or display on Radio, Television, Film, the Internet and/or any other visual, electronic or printed publication in connection with the Championship and/or IIHF activities in general and thus waive all rights of protection under any current or future privacy laws related to such data.
- l) I agree to abide by the commercial obligations of the IIHF to which my National Association is party.
- m) By not completing the back of this form, I confirm that I am and have only been a citizen of the country that I represent.

Control by the Tournament Directorate does not constitute acknowledgement by the IIHF that the player is eligible to take part in the Championship. Such control is limited to acknowledgement that the completed Entry Form has been received and the details correspond with the player's passport. The application of this Player Entry Form is limited to the period from the time the player signs the form until the conclusion of the event. This form supersedes all previous forms.

PLAYER ENTRY FORM

To be observed and completed only by players who have changed their citizenship or has surrendered a citizenship or has two or more citizenships.

To be eligible to participate in an IIHF championship a player who has changed his citizenship or is a citizen of two or more countries must be in accordance with IIHF By-law 205 as specified below:

- b) The player must submit (a) his signed Player Entry Form and (b) his individual valid national passport which must confirm that he is a citizen of the country he represents.
- c) When once a player has represented a country in any IIHF championship or in the Olympic competition or in the qualification to these competitions he will not be eligible to represent another country excepting that he may apply to the IIHF to represent another country provided that (a) he is a citizen to that country, (b) he has an international transfer card that was approved and dated by the IIHF at least four years before the start of the IIHF competition in which he wishes to participate, (c) he has participated for at least four consecutive years in the national competitions of his new country during which period he has neither transferred to another country nor played ice hockey within any other country, and (d) he has not played for his previous country in an IIHF competition during this four year period. Such a change will be allowed only once in a player's life and is final and irrevocable.
- d) A player who has represented a country in any IIHF championship, Olympic competition or in the qualifications to these competitions and has later acquired another citizenship shall still be eligible to represent his old country provided he is still a citizen of that country.
- e) If a country or part of it becomes independent, or if a country or part of it becomes incorporated into another country, or if two or more countries are united into a new country, or if a country is divided into more countries, a player who has already represented a country and whose citizenship was thus changed by decision of the state authorities, may apply to the IIHF to play for any one of the partitioned or united countries without a waiting period subject to his providing proof of his new citizenship. This particular choice may only be made once and is final and irrevocable.
- f) When a player has changed his citizenship or has acquired or has surrendered another citizenship and wants to represent his new country he must (a) have an IIHF international transfer card that was approved and dated by the IIHF at least two years before the start of the championship in which he wishes to participate and (b) he must prove that he has participated for at least two consecutive years in the national competitions of his new country during which period he has neither transferred to another country nor played ice hockey within any other country.
- g) When a player has multiple citizenship where the relevant citizenships are for countries of member national associations and he has never represented any country in any IIHF championship or an Olympic competition or in qualifications to these competitions, then in order to play for the country of his choice he must (a) prove that he has participated for at least two consecutive years in the national competitions and resident in the country that he wishes to represent during which period he has neither transferred to another country nor played ice hockey within any other country and (b) if the country of his choice is one to which the player has transferred then he must have had an IIHF international transfer card approved and dated by the IIHF at least two years prior to his proposed participation.
When a player wishes to establish his eligibility under subsections e) or f) or g) the member national association for which he wishes to play must submit an application to the IIHF together with all relating evidence at the latest four weeks before the competition or game in which the player wishes to play. The General Secretary is responsible for investigating the application and confirming the player's eligibility to play for the country concerned. Notwithstanding the above, the decision of the General Secretary is not conclusive proof of the eligibility of the player to play for the country concerned.
